The KJV translates Strong's G3610 in the following manner: servant (4x), household servant (1x).

Outline of Biblical Usage

I. one who lives in the same house as another, spoken of all who are under the authority of one and the same householder

A. a servant, a domestic

Strong's Definitions

οἰκέτης οἰκέτης, oy-ket'-ace; from G3611; a fellow resident, i.e. menial domestic:—(household) servant.

Thayer's Greek Lexicon ([Jump to Scripture Index](#))

οἰκέτης, οἰκέτου, ὁ (οἰκέω), from (Aeschylus and) Herodotus down, Latindomesticus, i. e. one who lives in the same house with another, spoken of all who are under the authority of one and the same householder, Sir. 4:30 Sir. 6:11, especially **a servant, domestic**; so in [Luke 16:13](#); [Acts 10:7](#); [Romans 14:4](#); [1 Peter 2:18](#); the Sept. for **עֲבָד**. See more fully on the word, Meyer on Romans, the passage cited (where he remarks that **οἰκέτης** is a more restricted term than **δοῦλος**, designating a **house-servant**, one holding closer relations to the family than other slaves; cf. **διάκονος** at the end, Schmidt, chapter 162.)

Concordance Results Shown Using the KJV

Strong's Number **G3610** matches the Greek οἰκέτης
(*oiketēs*),

which occurs 5 times in **5** verses in the **TR Greek**.

Luk 16:13

No servant **G3610** can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon.

Act 10:7

And when the angel which spake unto Cornelius was departed, he called two of his household servants, **G3610** and a devout soldier of them that waited on him continually;

Rom 14:4

Who art thou that judgest another man's servant? **G3610** to his own master he standeth or falleth. Yea, he shall be holden up: for God is able to make him stand.

Phm 1:25

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ *be* with your spirit. Amen.

1Pe 2:18

Servants, **G3610** *be* subject to *your* masters with all fear; not only to the good and gentle, but also to the froward.
