οἰκέτης oikétēs, oy-ket'-ace; from G3611; a fellow resident, i.e. menial domestic:--(household) servant.

oἰκέτης, oἰκέτου, ὁ (oἰκέω), from (Aeschylus and) Herodotus down, Latin*domesticus*, i. e. one who lives in the same house with another, spoken of all who are under the authority of one and the same householder, Sir. 4:30 Sir. 6:11, especially a servant, domestic; so in Luke 16:13; Acts 10:7; Romans 14:4; 1 Peter 2:18; the Sept. for T, છ. See more fully on the word, Meyer on Romans, the passage cited (where he remarks that oἰκέτης is a more restricted term than δοῦλος, designating a house-servant, one holding closer relations to the family than other slaves; cf. διάκονος at the end, Schmidt, chapter 162.)

Strong's Number **G3610** matches the Greek $0i\kappa \epsilon \tau \eta \zeta$ (*oiketēs*),

which occurs 5 times in 5 verses in the TR Greek.

No servant ^{G3610} can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon.
