Boston Oct 9th 1844

President Brigham Young

Beloved Brother

While the Sable shades of night
has drawn its dark curtains over the Earth, I seat myself by the
side of Brother Phelps table in the City of Boston to spread some of the
agitations of my mind before you, and it is a vivid peculiar feeling
I do it. May the God of Israel direct my pen in wisdom that I may
communicate to my beloved brother what I ought & no more.

* After a long tedious journey I have made my appearance in the City of
Boston, I was on the Stairs of Lakes 16 days amid wind storm & fire
when out it was difficult to make Harbour & when in difficult to get
out, our boat took fire 3 times Beside having a dreadful rough time
however I have no complaint to make, I with my wife and children
are all well, I leave these subjects, I have often wanted to talk about
but if I could see president Young one hour I could tell better
with my tongue what I wish than with my pen, It is so frequent
for Elders to write home to Vancouver what they see, hear, feel or some complaint
against somebody that I dislike to follow suit, yet I do feel it to be my
duty to give upon an account of the State of things in the Eastern States
as far as I can see hear & feel, I should have waited until I could have
had more of an opportunity of visiting the Clerks, Owing as I have an
opportunity of sending by private carriage. Now Br Young I am going
to give upon a simple statement of facts & feelings & your feelings &
concern of persons just as it is as near as I can without any intention
of bringing any accusation against any man, not even wishing
to have my communications seen by any but our own government
it will absolutely necessary. On my arrival at the Westfield Branch
& the Clerks, An Elder informed me that he attended the New Eng.
conference, & their appeared much difficulty arising in that quarter
upon a variety of subjects, but Jessie Woman Spurlock wife Burns
the most prominent one, she was turned out of the Church for
calling Adams or Mrs Smith a rascal, most difficulty appear to
be having in Westfield & Philadelphia, I visited a sick woman
in the Westfield Branch, for some reason the subject of marriage for
eternity rested with weight upon my mind, I did not know the cause
as it was the most foreign from my mind to introduce the subject
I enquired of Br Sparks if there had been any thing said upon the
subject, He informed me she had been seated to her husband
I asked who by, He said Elder Branham Elder of the prophet

I was a little surprised at this, ^{and} he informed me that Elder Brannan had been through the Church, calling collections for the prophet got considerable in that small branch. Mr. Smith was with him gathering funds at the same time from the Temple. His Brethren paid him \$200 or \$25 dollars for the Temple as he was one of the Twelve. He told me that Elders Smith Adams & Brannan are always together in all things visit the Churches constantly & try to gather one for the prophet, one for the Temple & Adams to pay a debt that he had incurred ^{or he had lent so much to the saints}, And practicing the spiritual with doctrine (as they call it) to perfection. After getting through with this Branch I took cars for Boston and last night at Boston stopped at Mr. Phelps' hotel. Phelps told me there was a meeting of the Church I immediately repaired to the place, & for the most of business waited to the stand, & took a seat some man seemed to be somewhat embarrassed at my presence, Elder Adams who of course by the way of New York & Philadelphia, Elder Smith asked what the feeling of the Twelve was towards him, in answer, spoke of the Office of President and it was his right, should contend for it through death & the grave &c. the first business I saw was John Hardy resign his Office as President, And another appointed in his stead, which was Joseph Ball who was contended for strenuously by Brannan & Mr. Smith I will confess some feeling came over me that made me squirm all over, I saw there was angry spirits, conflicting spirits, Elder Phelps was the only man that opposed openly, Elder Ball's appointment, & he was instantly bowed down, but I knew other felt opposed to the move, I saw trouble in the hearts of men I had just come in knew not what is going on during this movement I sat by the side of Mr. Smith, who said to me "There is an influence rising against Mr. Adams, But all is right with him he is a good man he upholds the Twelve I will stand by him until death" "Worlster has come out against us & I am cut him off" I asked how Mr. Brannan came to be marrying people for Eternity, He says I oppose him to do it, His Administrations are not legal "Yes they are my Elder can do it that has power to marry at all" "It is a right exclusively belonging to the question of the Twelve or the president of the Church not legal with those who are not endowed ^{refraince} That has reference to exclusive privilege, & not ^{refraince} dealing a man to his wife for Eternity for any Elder can do that" Here the conversation ended meeting closed & I went home with Mr. Phelps, I however gave out an appointment for a Church meeting on Saturday night, the whole week is to be taken up

with another long discussion between Adams and Bacheller. I
soon discovered from various sources that the conduct of Mr. Smith
Adams & Brown Ball & Co had been such in crossing their spiritual
wife Elaws, visiting the Church, uniting together in keeping wrong, reviving
over all rights of presiding Elders, as the claim that Mr. Smith was
one of the "Sooke, the people's Brother," & Adams was the great Apostle to
the gentiles as Paul ever the 13th Apostle (which claim was held up to me) until
some of the strongest pillars were shaking, & if any opposed them in their
deeds they would trample them down until presiding Elders were leaving
their post, & some ready to come out in battle array openly against
the Church. I heard of New York where the Revd Mr. Hardy resign'd &
about to visit the poor against the Church, Phelps, Park, Brookford & other Ministers
wrote & the good men feeling that they could bear no longer
with a belief that Adams, Smith, Brauner were combined with the Presps to
do any thing to carry out their designs, preach potlicks & voting
for Park for a little while, & was using his influence to remove all
presiding Elders that would not favor their designs & put in others
would, it looks like it in Boston, for Elder Ball has taught as well
as Mr. Smith the Somell girls that is not easy to have intercourse with
the men wld they please & Elder Ball has to sleep with these women because
they have tried to remove a good presiding Elder in Somell to put
in Dr. Polk who is in their company, but they would not have him
the Somell Church is shaking, And in fine to speak just as I feel it
seems as though if I had not come or been running to have taken
a different course that all these Eastern Churches would rapidly go to
the devil. If one say my spirit is not concurring with Adams
Williams & Brauner & Ball take a different course from what they
are taking, I have been with them a little while to day our spirits don't
agree, they keep together in a cluster they don't visit the sick ones much
as soon as I awoke this morning I told it my duty to visit Mr. Hardy
& the tried ones I have done so & done much good, I told Mr. Hardy &
all to hold still, & not write against the Church, he say he won't do it unless
they undertake to crush him, & perhaps not then, the difficulty will many
is to think the queen of the Sooke know these things in Adams & Mr.
& wish at it & sustain it in it, And my candid opinion opinion is
that if this loose principle which they are presenting or what report says they a-
re that the Church will sustain a great ^{grievous} blow that we had fires enough
to contend with at this time without having to deal with scattered
nonsense, for it seems as though some Elders thought that their whole ^{cause}
depended upon accommodating their tail, some in this country think that the
ministers now not fairly clothed with but that I do not know so much
about, But some good men are sustaining an injury in these things
I believe,

I inquired to day why they were passing the course they are on
the subject political affairs, "Because the post party are supporting the
paper some contress after the election, I told them if they would
fill my hat with gold I would not do it. I asked what they was going
to do with the money collected for the Temple, "Send it up by Elder
Adams, who is going to Vancouver in few days, ^{I hope against} of speculation
will not be carried on in the East upon that subject but what ~~is done~~
may reach the Temple, Elder Lyne is much opposed to the course going
on & wrote a short peace in the prophet last week warning the women to leave
but Brannan said it shoud not stand open in if he had seen
it, they dont like to publish any thing that will check their progress.
Even Elder Young I have found out a part of my baggot before you
open my book I am disengaged or weak in faith myself, But I am
not acquainted with either of them, I am in the best of spirits, Elder Abbott
wrote me a letter last year to Vancouver upon the same subject, perhaps he
did not understand it then, ^{perhaps} got out same, But what I have written
I have given as I came to me, some report, some positive testimony
some I rec, hear, & some I feel, I am not an accuser of my brother
I dont pretend to present it as an accusation, only to let you know
a state of things that do apparently exist, their seems to be a desire that
Elder Adams & Smith & Brannan may separate from the Church & let them
alone & not continually be racing through among them & keeping them
all in a foam, Holding & plots to make money & bragging all the while of
each others greatness through the prophet, you may weigh these things &
have them for what they will tell, But you may not mind & shall
take a diffrent course in my ministry. The following is a
synopsis of my intentions. To sustain Elder Young as the president
of the Church in connection with the queen of the Indepe, to set before them
the course pursued at the conference in Vancouver, to exert man that are
able to negotiate to Vancouver, carry money & arms, appoint an agent to
receive the subscriptions for the Temple that will appropriate it where it is
applied & to do what they can, And to require the written authority
of any man that come to collect money or on any Church matters
signed by president Young or the Presister or both that old papers
will not answer. To oppose the claims of Elder Weston to lead the Church
according to the circular he is spreading in the Eastern States. To warn
all against iniquity & improper conduct, & if they see things wrong in
others not to make hypocrites of their own faith but stand still
and all shall be right in time, That the Church will not support
iniquity, I would advise not to mingle with politicians or the election
this falls, shall try to save those who are tried & brought as far as they have
a disposition to do right & mingle in the society of all the saints.

As my mission is not in America I shall not take the responsibility of regulating things myself but will try to give good advice as I pass along, requesting all to maintain their integrity until the Districts are appointed & classed in order. I have a meeting tomorrow night in Salem, Thursday night in New Bedford, Saturday night in Boston & Sunday next week in Lowell, & Thursday night in Peterborough etc go to church get my family return to New York & sail to Liverpool, where if you see anything wrong in any of my relations say that it may be taken from me for God knows I went to do right for I feel more than a usual deep interest in the welfare of the Church at the present time.

I have written this letter in great haste in the night & it may be a trouble to read it but I trust Dr Richards will make it out & please give my respects to all the quorum & all who inquire after me remember me to Bro & Sister Webster, Tell them I visited Follen House & all was well.

By way of conclusion I wish to say that in all my remarks about things here I have given them only cause to me justified up, perhaps much allowance out to be made, things may be much exaggerated by report & others say that Adams is a good man doing what he can for the Free Church, but I leave everything as it is given with you. I would not wish to have this letter go to Adams & Mr Smith as I designed it for yourself for if you do we shall have to have all things carefully until they are righted up.

Boston Monday Morning Oct 14th following on another sheet
Elder Kyng

I am passing along with time & now I had my meeting on Saturday night with the saints, had the visit of God with me quite plain, to the saints about many things older Adams & Brainerd were present, the saints seemed to be edified I urge the case of the temple, among other things there is some or considerable money put into the hands of Mr Smith for the temple too much I do not know older Mifflin starts to move or soon I have told the saints to put money into his hands for the temple & for him to take their money & send

He has got some, you will engine into it when it comes
when I closed my meeting Elder Brannan proposed a
charge against Elder John Hardy for the Slander for
saying they had been engaged in the wicked work business
& I immediately advised Mr Adams & Brannan to let it
alone at present & not stir it up as Hardy had withdrawn
from the presidency & stood as a private member on purpose to
let it alone, but Br Brannan said he was advised by Br
Adams & Snell to go ahead & rip it up & he should do so
the trial comes on to morrow night before the whole
church & not a council of elders. The object on one side
is crush Hardy, & on the other to raze all Hell over for certainly
a striking sweep it will be, upon may look out for a
storm in Boston. I feel a little sorry that man are so many
temptations at this time to try to crush any body that says a word.
I would rather they would let things rest a little longer, anything that
can be said up in Boston will go to the world, but I have tried
to clear my mind by giving the best counsel I could.
I preach twice yesterday to a full congregation in Boston & a
good time the spirit of God was with me. In the Evening I
attended the religious discussion in Marlborough Chapel between Adams
& Baddeley. There was a large audience they took about \$300 at
11cts each, Adams far gained the day & think in the public mind
Adams was with me yesterday, manifest a good spirit &
think has a disposition to maintain the Truth, as far as there
is any wrong I think it exists more with Br. M. than me
what he does he does to sustain Br. M. & Snell he says as he is
one of the quorum of the Twelve, I don't wish to injure Bro. Adams
or any body else, but his feeling has been expressed to me by some
good men that they thought it was a great injury for several elders
to go together in such a way where it did not seem necessary
though among all the elders, among the right & authority of
the presiding elders, crushing & removing them, many feel bad
about it, I think Blair will be some fire or nest us smoke
in this eastern country & when Br. says I am going to stop
writing about those things, perhaps you will think I am like a
cow give milk & kick it over but I have been between two fires
& had to write as things appear to me from hour to hour as I
have paper along, and I wish you to understand that nothing
that I have written is not by way of charge against any man
but tell it my duty to let you know how things now lie
letter as far as I can, Elder Adams informs me that you had

sent for him, I wish to say that if he is sent out on any other
mission I think it would be well to advise him to take a lame &
little more reserved, relative to female friends society & not to
~~boast~~^{boast} of power & authority that he does not possess, but for his
to understand what queen he does belong to. Father & mother
Father Wickham feels bad about things here. He is among the Clerks
in the eastern country & I think is doing ~~now~~^{good} very well consider
ing him. Elder Adams is capable of doing much good in
the cause & he takes a righteous course. X
May God bless you & give you wisdom in all things
& the queen of the Universe with you in the prayer of
