One thing to note is that despite some hand-wringing in the Church about the perils

of delaying marriage (see a recent article about this in the *Ensign*), there's no evidence

that either current or former Mormons are in fact delaying marriage-of those who get

married, the median age for current Mormons to do so is 22, and for former Mormons it's 23.
