POPULATION OF UTAH BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Utah by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Utah was organized as a territory September 9, 1850, and admitted as a state January 4, 1896. Table 1 shows the population of Utah at each census from 1850 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 276,749 as compared with a population in 1890 of 207,905, representing an increase since 1890 of 68,844, or 33.1 per cent. A small portion of this increase is due to the fact that there were 2,848 Indians and 26 other persons, or a total of 2,874 persons, on Indian reservations, etc., in Utah, who were specially enumerated in 1890 under the provisions of the census act, but were not included in the general population of the state at that census. In 1850 the population of the territory which afterwards became the state was 11,380, and during the ten years from 1850 to 1860 it increased to 40,273, or 253.9 per cent. During the decade from 1860 to 1870 the population increased at the rate of 115.5 per cent, and the growth of the state has been by increasing numbers for each of the three succeeding decades.

The population of Utah in 1900 is more than twenty-four times as large as that given for 1850, the year when Utah was organized as a territory.

The total land surface of Utah is, approximately, 82,190 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 2.5; 1900, 3.4.

Table 2 shows the population of Utah by counties at each census from 1850 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

The following territorial changes in the counties of Utah have been made since 1890: Wayne organized from part of Piute in 1892; Carbon organized from part of Emery in 1894; part of Kane annexed to Garfield; and part of Sanpete annexed to Utah.

Of the 27 counties in the state all but 2 have increased in population during the decade, the largest percentages of increase being for San Juan, 180.3 per cent; Uinta, 133.8 per cent; Grand, 112.4 per cent; Tooele, 98.9 per cent; Juab, 80.6 per cent; Millard, 40.8 per cent; Garfield, 38.4 per cent; Utah, 36.6 per cent; Sevier, 36.3 per cent; and Salt Lake, 33.0 per cent.

The 2 counties showing a decrease in population are Emery and Piute, but this decrease is due wholly to the fact that parts of these counties were taken to form other counties.

Table 4 shows the population of Utah by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

Of the above named 66 incorporated places, 18 have more than 2,000 inhabitants, and of these 4 have more than 5,000, namely, Salt Lake City, with 58,531; Ogden City, with 16,313; Provo City, with 6,185; and Logan, with 5,451 inhabitants.

Salt Lake City is the only city in the state which has a population in 1900 of more than 25,000, and for this city a summary is presented in table 6, showing its population from 1860 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each of the ten-year periods.

The population of Salt Lake City, beginning with 8,236 in 1860, increased to 12,854 in 1870, or 56.1 per cent, and to 20,768 in 1880, or 61.6 per cent. In the following decade, from 1880 to 1890, the population more than doubled, but during the last ten years the gain has been comparatively small.
